Course Operations

Because Project management is intensely personal, this course is not going to train you to manage projects using a cookie-cutter project management approach. Each person who manages projects, does it in their own way – even when they are following the same method or using the same tools. Furthermore, every organization has its own project management approach, tools, and expectations.

You already are a project manager - even though you may never have thought of yourself as one. You have already been managing all sorts of projects.

Therefore, in this course you will explore your own abilities and strengths as they relate to project management by managing an actual project. The project you will manage is not a pretend project.

Your project is this class.

You will fill the role of project manager and there will be times when you fill the role of a Quality Control person and times when you fill the role as the client for your colleagues in the course. This allows you a 360 degree view of what is involved in managing projects! I will serve as your client and at times you will also serve in the client role with your colleagues in the class.

This course focuses on Project Management as a profession.

Professional project managers manage project for their clients.

That means no client = no project.

So, while the PM processes we analyze in this course <u>can</u> be used by individuals to manage their own personal projects, that is not the focus in this course.

Lastly, keep in mind that in most of our interactions, I will be interacting with you as your client - but I never stop being your instructor. As your instructor, I am keenly focused on creating a safe learning space for ALL students to advance everyone's knowledge and skills. What makes it a safe space is that while you are being pushed into the role of a PM, you also will have access to tons of help to be successful. You are not expected to know everything at the start of the class. You will learn as you go. Trust yourself. You already have the basic skills and knowledge necessary to succeed in this class! This class will help you organize your knowledge in a new way to allow you to apply your knowledge in new practices. Students who stay engaged in the work and invest the time necessary succeed in this class!
