

- 10. Perform (lots of) legal analysis.





Late or Missed Assignments

Late Assignments: Late assignments will be accepted under specific circumstances and if at least one of the professors is notified prior to the due date. Ten percent will be deducted for each day an assignment is late past the due date, unless one of the professors are notified prior to the due date. However, the late penalty will be capped at half the value of the assignment (e.g., a 10 point assignment can have a maximum deduction of 5 late points). Consequently, it is in your best interest to submit all assignments, even if late. The only exception to this rule is Discussion Board posts. Because Discussion Boards require timely student participation to be effective, Initial or Response Posts not made before or on the last day of a Module will have points deducted for partial posts or zero points for no post.
