NTR 353: Perspectives on The Western Diet: Food,

Health, and Sustainability

Course and Faculty Information

Course Description: This online course will introduce the student to political, ethical, social, and cultural issues inherent in the U.S. food system. Topics will include examination of U.S. food guidance, the food system and food environment, the history of food and farm policy, food security, and aspects of sustainability in relation to food system impacts on the health of humans, society, and the environment.

Credits: 3

Prerequisites: minimum 45 hours. Credit is allowed for only NTR 353 or NTR 394 (The Western Diet: Food, Health, & Sustainability) or SOS 353

- Use evidence-based information to critically analyze and report on influences of, benefits of, and detriments of the U.S. food system on dietary intake, food access issues, and sustainability issues.
- Describe steps to become an active participant in making a healthier, robust, sustainable, and equitable US Food System

- Complete assignments by the due dates specified.

Assignment Descriptions

Discussions

Discussion assignments can earn a total of 15 points: your original post is worth 10 points and should address the prompt, and utilize one source cited from evidence based, reliable sources; you should comment and/or respond to at least two other student's posts prior to the due date listed on the course schedule to earn the final 5 points.

Posts are expected to be professional in tone (meaning proper grammar and spelling but also respectful to others).

Quizzes

Quizzes will be given online and will be comprised of multiple-choice, true/false and short answer questions based on the class readings, supplemental readings, and discussion board assignments. They are designed to be 'open book', meaning it is understood that you may open the quiz, and go through the Module material while you answer the corresponding quiz questions. The reason is because we are not assessing your memorization skills with the content, but instead are measuring your engagement with the material and application of course content.

Explore and Share

In three modules, you will be given a selection of resources to choose from (Module 1 we will explore academic journals, Module 2 we will explore podcasts, and Module 3 we will explore program). You will use the posted prompts to explore a resource from the list, and complete the assessment question provided.

Find, Learn, Teach

In three modules, you will select from the list of topics covered by course material and choose one to learn more about. You will research the topic and create a teaching tool designed for a younger audience (elementary school through high school age).

Create!

Your final project will be a tool that you create, to teach a course concept. You will define the topic, the target audience, and the main point of the tool. Examples of tools you may decide to create include a cooking video, a podcast interview, an infographic, a learning game, a farm tour toolkit, etc.

Submitting Assignments

All assignments, unless otherwise announced, MUST be submitted to the designated area of Canvas. Do not submit an assignment via email.

Assignment due dates follow Arizona Standard time and are always at 11:59PM. Click the following link to access the <u>Time Converter</u> (http://www.thetimezoneconverter.com/) to ensure you account for the difference in Time Zones. Note: Arizona does not observe daylight savings time.

Email assignment to instructor before the deadline IF an issue prevents you from submitting on time through Canvas. Email is an acceptable alternative only when technical issues have occurred that may interfere with turning in work by the deadline.

Late or Missed Assignments

Notify the instructor **BEFORE** an assignment is due if an urgent situation arises and you are unable to submit the assignment on time.

Assignments may be turned in early.

This course applies the "It Happens" concept to due dates. What this means is that each student may ask for a two day extension **one time** during the course, for any reason at all (life happens!). Please note that this may only be used once during the semester (the extension will be granted for that Module's assignments).

After you use your "It Happens" extension, if you need to turn in an assignment late, you will be allowed to do so at a 10% per day penalty IF:

- You notify the instructor before the due date, if possible, or as soon as possible after the due date (if there was an emergency preventing you from notification prior)
- You provide a valid reason for being late, with documentation as requested
- You notify the instructor once you complete the assignment

If a *serious* illness or *exceptional* emergency prevents you from turning in assigned work on time, the instructor may waive the late penalty. This will be based on the instructor's discretion, and proper notification and documentation will be required.

If a problem should occur with the ASU Canvas site, and it impacts a course deadline, extensions will be allowed for the entire class; in this case, an announcement will be placed on Canvas once it is up and running.

instructor immediately, before the deadline has passed. Student should attach the correct assignment to that notification email.

- **Double-check that the assignment was completed and successfully submitted**. Sometimes, files do not upload properly the first time. Double check that you turned in what you intended, and that it successfully uploaded.
- Email assignment to instructor before the deadline IF an issue prevents them from submitting on time through Canvas. As technical issues do occur, it is still the student's responsibility to turn in work on time. Email is an acceptable alternative only when technical issues have occurred that may interfere with turning in work by the deadline.
- Secure access to a working computer and reliable internet. Since this is an online class, it is assumed that students have secured a working computer with reliable internet connection to complete the coursework.
