## **Course Description:**

This course will examine the religious traditions of India in their material, historical and arthistorical contexts. We will study the emergence, development, and contemporary expressions of these traditions through an in-depth study of art, architecture, and textual genres. The class will be encouraged to take advantage of local resources and there will be a mandatory field trip to the Jain and Hindu temples at Phoenix, as well as a visit to the Sikh art gallery at the Phoenix Art Museum. All course material will be uploaded on canvas. Assignments will consist of discussions, quizzes, short essays, and a term paper. There is no prerequisite or textbook for this course.
